Why Should I Use a MCPA Member?

Master Concrete Placers are passionate about their work, so much so that they formed an organisation of like minded people to lift the standard of concrete placing within New Zealand.

Master Concrete Placers are encouraged to -

- Attend relevant training related to their industry.
- Have the required qualifications that they need to complete the work in their field (eg. Licenced Building Practitioners Scheme, BCITO National Certificates in Concrete etc.)
- Attend NZMCPA Conference, and other industry related conferences, on a regular basis to up skill and be aware of changes within their industry.
- To have Health & Safety guidelines in place and where appropriate be a member of a recognised Health & Safety Service provider (Eg. Site Safe or Hazard Co).

Guarantees?

Will you guarantee my concrete won't crack? **NO**. No one can guarantee that your concrete won't crack! Due to expansion and contraction all concrete does crack.

However, there are steps that can be taken to help alleviate uncontrolled cracking - including curing, using reinforcing mesh, compacted fill, even depth of concrete, expansion cutting and if required shrinkage control joints.

Discuss these options with your concrete placer and be sure if comparing quotes that you are, in fact, comparing the same thing - that these are not added as "optional extras" after you have accepted the quote.



When Things Go Wrong...

Concrete is a natural product that often has additives added to it, many things can go wrong, the difference is how your placer handles this.

A Master Concrete Placer is expected to uphold the MCPA Code Of Conduct and to work with the client to find a mutually agreeable outcome. The MCPA is not a "complaints department" but by using an MCPA member the chances of having something go wrong are lessened.
